

# Peace Out Scarf by Susan Sheby

## Materials:

2 skeins Knit Collage Wildflower yarn US size 35 or 36 needles

## Size:

One size fits all

## Gauge:

Approximately 5 stitches and 6 rows = 4 inches in stockinette

## Abbreviations:

sl: slip stitch (purlwise on WS, knitwise on RS)

k: knit p: purl

k2t: knit two stitches together

ssk: slip stitch knitwise, slip next stitch knit wise,

knit those two stitches together

yo: yarn over

## Pattern:

Set up:

Cast on 10 stitches using long-tail method.

Row 1 (WS): sl, p across Row 2 (RS): sl, k across Row 3: sl, p across Row 4: sl, k across

Row 5: sl, p across

Complete the following pattern six times:

Rows 1, 3, 5, 7 (RS): sl, k2t, yo twice, ssk, k2t, yo twice, ssk, k

Rows 2, 4, 6, 8 (WS): sl, p, [p, k into double yarn over], p 2, [p, k into double yarn over], p 2

Rows 9, 11, 13, 15: sl, k 2, k2t, yo twice, ssk, k 3

Rows 10, 12, 14, 16: sl, p 3, [p, k into double yarn over], p 4

#### Finish:

Row 1 (RS): sl, k across Row 2: sl, p across Row 3: sl, k across Row 4: sl, p across Bind off and weave in ends.



## Pattern Continued

## Macrame Fringe:

From remaining yarn, cut twenty-four 24-inch pieces (twelve pieces will be used on each end of the scarf).

\* For the sake of this tutorial, each of our fringe pieces is half yellow and half red.

Take one 24-inch piece of fringe, fold it in half, and loop it on to the corner of the scarf. Repeat for the other corner.



Now holding two pieces of fringe together at a time, make five more loops of fringe, evenly spaced, for a total of seven fringe sections. Each fringe section will have a right side (yellow), and a left side (red).



Starting at the far right end, take both sides of end fringe and knot them around the right side of the second set of fringe as shown.



## Macrame Fringe Instructions Continued

Repeat by taking the left side of the second set of fringe and knotting it around the right side of the third set of fringe.



Continue down the line until you knot the left side of the sixth set of fringe around both sides of the fringe on the end. Adjust the knots accordingly so that all pieces of fringe hang evenly spaced. You now have six sets of fringe, each with a right and left side.



For the second row of knots, knot the left side of one set of fringe around the right side of the adjacent set as before (this will leave the right side of the first set and the left side of the last set free).







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
